## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work was started by Samata Shikshan Sanstha, Pune which is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The College is affiliated to North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon and is aided by the Department of Social Justice and Special Assistance, Government of Maharashtra.

Samata Shikshan Sanstha was established under the leadership of Prof. Vilas Wagh with a broad vision to serve the downtrodden and weaker sections of the society. Since its inception it has been rendering social service to the society through a number of programs and activities such as Ashram Schools, Hostels for poor girls and boys.

The Sanstha functions on a strong conviction that it can make a difference in the lives of many of those who are less fortunate fellow beings of the society. In response to the problems of people and need of area, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Social Work was started in the year 1995 at Morane, in Dhule Taluka & District, which is one of the most backward and under-development districts of Maharashtra. This is the only Social Work College in Dhule District,

The College is located on Dhule - Sakri Road at Morane, about 7 kms from Dhule bus stand. The College imparts training in social work both at undergraduate as well as post- graduate levels, leading to three year Bachelor's of Social Work (BSW) and Two Years Master's of Social Work (MSW) courses respectively. Both the courses are generic in nature so as to prepare the students to accept the challenges and take up responsibilities of working with people having different problems and areas having their own needs with a holistic and participative approach.

## ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Inclusive Development is a pro-poor approach that equally values and incorporates the contribution of all stakeholders- including marginalized groups in addressing development issues. It promotes transparency and accountability and enhances development cooperation outcomes through collaboration between civil society, government and private sector actors. Inclusive development consists of ensuring that all marginalized and excluded are stakeholders in development process.

Development process fails when government neglects the needs of the very people.

UNDP maintains that many groups are excluded from development because of their gender, ethnicity, age, sexual orientation, disability or poverty. The effects of such exclusion are raising levels of inequality around the world. Development cannot effectively reduce poverty unless all groups contribute opportunities, share the benefits of development and participate in decision making. The goal of inclusive development is to achieve an inclusive society, able to accommodate differences and to value diversity.

**Dimension of inclusive development:**

1. Social Inclusion, exclusion and participation.
2. Poverty and distribution
3. Political dimension
4. The environment dimension

Inclusive development as a concept is not only growing in the development literature, but also in usage in the current development policy realm. The importance of inclusion and the role of equality on development has gained significant attention in recent years and this is reflected in the current development debate among international organizations, governments and NGO's. After having gained a better understanding of the distinct meaning of the concept inclusive development and its dimension, it is important to explore the use of the concept in practice.

Therefore, in this context the college has decided to hold a **Two Days National Seminar on Inclusive Development and Marginalised Groups**.
